II. Background of the college with Vision, Mission and Objectives:

Background of the College:

Dr. M. Abdul Haq founded Osmania College in Kurnool in 1947 to serve the people of backward Rayalaseema who could not otherwise afford to go to distant places for higher studies. He used his official contacts to get the college affiliated to Madras University. The college was named after His Exalted Highness the Nizam of Hyderabad who made a generous donation of two lakh rupees in 1946. Through the joint efforts of Anjuman-e-Islamiah and Dr. M. Abdul Haq (Founder), the college was established in 1947, which is paying rich dividends to all sections of society and to say the least every house in Kurnool has a graduate from the College.

The institution has been established as a Linguistic and Muslim Minority Institution under Article 30 of the Constitution of India to cater to the educational needs of the Minority Community. The College is recognized under 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act of 1956 and is now affiliated to Rayalaseema University, Kurnool. The college has been enjoying a good reputation for the past six decades. It was permitted by the Government of Andhra Pradesh in Memo.No.57213/CE-1/85-3 Education dated 21-8-1986 to start full fledged parallel sections for women. Parallel sections for women were established during 1986-1987 in response to the local demand. The Management has provided a separate campus and buildings for women's education keeping in view the safety and privacy of girl students.

The history of the college remains incomplete without a reference to the invaluable services rendered by Dr. M. Abdul Haq (Founder) and his son, Mr. M. Mahfuzul Haq. Dr. M. Abdul Haq was an educationist par excellence who went on holding high positions in the realms of higher education. Besides being the Principal of Government Mohammadan College, Madras and the Principal of Presidency College, Madras, he held the office of Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Aligarh Muslim University in 1952. He died in harness as Chairman, Madras Public Service Commission, Madras in March, 1958. He was associated with the establishment of Farooq College in Feroke, Malabar, Jamal Mohammad College in Tiruchirapalli, New College and South Indian Education Trust's Women's College in Madras. The Urdu University established in Kurnool by the Government of Andhra Pradesh is named as Dr. M. Abdul Haq Urdu University as a token of our founder's yeoman services to the field of education.

Mr. Mahfuzul Haq was the Secretary and Correspondent of the Osmania College Managing Committee for a long time. His period witnessed setting up of laboratories and improvisation of infrastructural facilities. During his time there was unprecedented development and expansion. He established the following institutions:

- 1. Parallel Degree sections for Women
- 2. Osmania Junior College for Girls
- 3. Osmania Law College
- 4. Osmania College of Education.

He was instrumental in starting several vocational courses in the College.

Mrs. Azra Javed is the present Secretary and Correspondent of the Managing Committee. She is the granddaughter of Dr. M. Abdul Haq (Founder) and the daughter of Mr. M. Mahfuzul Haq. She assumed charge as Secretary and Correspondent on 26-11-2000 and since then she has been evincing great interest in the expansion and development of the institution.

The College has been enjoying the Autonomous Status since 2005. The College is Reaccredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC (Accreditation, cycle 2). The college was selected as 'Centre of Excellence for Best Practices' in 2014 by the CCE, Hyderabad. It was also awarded 'A' grade by the CCE, based on KPI, in a state-wide evaluation of the colleges.

- 2. To provide inclusive education for inculcating human values, professionalism, and scientific temper in all sections of students with special focus on women students.
